



On September 15, beginning at 7:30 p.m., we will be holding a Class Graduation for our group who began taking lessons last January. Congratulations to all!





IN OUR OPINION

Well, here we are again at the time of year when school starts; not only the elementary and high schools, but the square dance "schools" as well. In most schools the size of the classes are fairly predictable. Not so in square dance classes. At this time of hurting and even folding clubs, the size of the class is critical and a sign of their future.

Why not make this the year that everyone makes a concerted effort to bring someone to class. Sure, many of you have been members of your club for many years and have brought countless numbers of your friends into the club. But don't stop now. Keep up the good work. For the newer club members the job may be easier. It's just a matter of convincing friends and family members what the benefits of square dancing really are.

One of the first things that struck us about square dancing is the emotional benefit that one receives. It is obvious that there are many physical benefits look at all the 70+ year old people still dancing and looking great! What we mean by emotional benefit is that of putting aside all of your cares and concerns so that you are able to concentrate on the caller and, consequently, come away feeling completely refreshed. How can you possibly convey this feeling to someone else — they must experience it for themselves. It is getting them there that first night that is the trick.

One way to get them there is... don't send them, take them and stay there with them throughout the night. All classes need angels, so do your club a favor and hang in there for another class year. Get to know the new dancers and have them get to know you. Not only will your club benefit, but you will too. many, and everywhere else.

Callerlab has printed and published thousands of pages of publications to help callers and dancers. These publications are used by dancers and callers everywhere, including the members of other square dance organizations.

Callerlab members are featured in nearly all of the calling slots at the National Square Dance Convention and conduct the caller training sessions at these same conventions.

Callerlab has established a Caller-Coach program to improve caller skills and thereby better serving dancers. Callerlab also provides a broad range of caller training sessions at its annual convention.

When BMI and ASCAP threatened clubs in the United States with license fees for every dance, Callerlab and Roundalab working together, negotiated a new form of licensing so that dance leaders could take over this obligation from the clubs.

So as you can see, Callerlab has done quite a bit for square dancing over the years and they're not done yet!

WHAT'S CALLERLAB DOING FOR SQUARE DANCING?

Callerlab, an international organization for over 3,000 square dance callers, held its first convention in 1974. However, the roots of Callerlab go back to the mid 1960's. Callerlab people have been working in many ways to help square dancing since then. To help everyone understand Callerlab and what it is doing, we offer this list of accomplishments.

More than 20 years ago, Callerlab members developed dance programs that have been accepted world wide. These dance programs let you go anywhere in the world and dance.

Callerlab members documented and negotiated international agreement on the definition of all the calls we use. For the first time ever, calls were taught the same way in California as they were in New England — or old England, Ger-




CONVERT AN EARLY BIRD? IT'S EASIER THAN IT LOOKS

For those of you who chose to show you support for the 47th National Convention in the early going purchased "Crown Jewel Certificates," better known as "Early Birds." You saved yourself money and at the same time allowed the 47th National Convention to begin operations and preparations for the convention in the black financially. The Carolinas Board sincerely thanks you for your support.

Now the question is, "What do I do with this Early Bird?" The answer, "You convert it!" In this case conversion is easy. If you haven't received a packet of information including materials and instructions needed for the conversion process of your Early Bird, please call or write the Registration and Housing Office at P.O. Box 562814, Charlotte, NC 28256-2814; (704) 566-9664 or (704) 566-9770. They will send you a registration form and instruct you in completing the form to obtain your convention registration.

You may convert your Crown Jewel Certificate anytime before the end of the Convention in 1998. You can convert it upon arrival at the Convention Center in Charlotte or you can convert ahead of time and speed the arrival/check in process.

Conversion of Crown Jewel Certificates prior to your arrival involves using the standard registration form noted above and sending it to the Convention address listed above. If you want to purchase additional merchandise, such as program books, cook books, special events tickets, etc., you must send the



required funds for these items, but no registration money. Where you would indicate the amount for the registration fee. write in "Early Bird." It will be helpful if you write your Crown Jewel Certificate numbers on the registration form, but it is not necessary, we will find you in the computer anyway. Your cost of registration (your ticket to the convention floor) is what you bought when you acquired your Early Bird so you don't need to send money for this. If you desire housing in Charlotte, you must indicate your preference (one, two, three and four) on the registration form. Remember, you do not send housing money to the Convention. You will receive hotel or motel confirmation direct from the hotel or motel, then you must send you housing deposit direct to the hotel or motel. For those who will be RVing at the Convention, the camping fee is paid to the Convention at the time you send in your registration form.

When you send your registration to the Convention Office, it will be processed and a registration confirmation number will be sent back to you.

Upon arrival at the Convention Center in June of 1998, there will be a Registration Packet Pick Up Location at the entrance. This will be set up alphabetically so all you will need to remember is your name. This way you will be able to quickly pick up your individual packet containing the items you ordered on the registration form. Keeping a copy of what you ordered, and checking the packet at the pick up window, will ensure that you have the correct items and same time and difficulty in trying to make corrections later.

We stress that the conversion is simple, however, when you try to write down the process it begins to look complicated. The conversion does take some careful thought to ensure that you get the things you want and that the information provided is accurate. Our aim is to provide you with a means to do as much ahead of time as possible. This will take some of the confusion and hassle out of your arrival at the 47th National Convention on June 24-27, 1998 in Charlotte, NC. See you all there in 1998!


